Generally, Restorative Nursing care plans are initiated when a resident is discharged from formalized physical, occupational, or speech rehabilitation therapy. A resident may also be started on a Restorative nursing care plan when he/she is admitted to the facility with restorative needs, but is not a candidate for formalized rehabilitation therapy, or when a restorative need arises during the course of a custodial stay. Restorative Nursing care plans: Do not require a physician ' s order.
