Inability to consume oral intake related to medical interventions because of acute respiratory distress as evidence by patient being ventilated at 15 breath/min with a FiO₂ at 100% Inadequate caloric intake related to decrease appetite caused by symptoms from COPD as evidence by patient usual diet intake supplying 53% of needs and 13 lb weight loss

Soon after, the HCP evaluates Emma and determines that she has respiratory syncytial virus (RSV) prescribes the following: NPO status, IV fluids, Ventolin (albuterol) aerosol, diphenhydramine (Benadryl) 0.5 mg/kg every 8 hours PO, oxygen set to 1/2 liter per nasal cannula, and nasal suction with normal saline prn.

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
