In 2002 and 2003, UNESCO asked an international group of linguists to develop a framework for determining the vitality of a language in order to assist in policy development, identification of needs and appropriate safeguarding measures. This Ad Hoc Expert Group on Endangered Languages elaborated a landmark concept paper entitled "Language Vitality and Endangerment", which established the following nine criteria :

Language vitality - UNESCO

UNESCO's methodological guideline entitled 'Language Vitality and Endangerment' (LVE)¹ was developed by an Ad hoc expert group comprising linguists from various regions in 2001-2002 and adopted by an international meeting 'Safeguarding Endangered Languages' held at UNESCO Headquarters in 2003.

UNESCO has begun a new phase to address the issue of language endangerment. A group of linguists and language advocates worked in collaboration with UNESCO from November 2001 and March 2003 to formulate ways of assessing language vitality and produced a set of guidelines that are given below.

Degrees of endangerment. The present edition designates the degrees of endangerment a little differently than the previous editions. The new terminology is based on UNESCO's Language Vitality and Endangerment framework that establishes six degrees of vitality/endangerment based on nine factors. Of these factors, the most salient is that of intergenerational transmission.

UNESCO's Atlas of the World's Languages in Danger categorises 2,473 languages into five levels of endangerment: unsafe, definitely endangered, severely endangered, critically endangered and extinct. More than 200 languages have become extinct around the world over the last three generations.
