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Their advice for mentoring new nurses came down to three important principles: Let Them Find Their Way Provide the supervision necessary to ensure patient safety is never at risk, but avoid excessive hand-holding. RNs need to be able to think for themselves. Within reason, give the new nurse space to figure things out.
