#### **Paulo Freire and Critical Pedagogy**

Paulo Freire and the idea of critical pedagogy Paulo Freire (1921–1997) was a champion of what's known today as critical pedagogy: the belief that teaching should challenge learners to examine power structures and patterns of inequality within the status quo.

Critical pedagogy insists that the negative and unfair aspects of education can and should be removed, reformed or replaced with something better. What is Freire's 'pedagogy of the oppressed' Paulo Freire (1921-1997) was a Brazilian philosopher

and educationalist who developed his own theory called "the pedagogy of the oppressed" (Freire, 1996).

## Freire's Critical Pedagogy and 'Pedagogy of the Oppressed'

Paulo Freire created "critical pedagogy", where the teacher doesn't teach, but is learning while in dialogue with the students. And the students learn while teaching. In critical pedagogy, the student's actions aren't limited to receiving, sorting and storing the teacher's banking deposit.

Paulo Freire - Pedagogy4Change - Pedagogy for Change Critical pedagogy was founded by the Brazilian philosopher and educator Paulo Freire, who promoted it through his 1968 book, Pedagogy of the Oppressed. It subsequently spread internationally, developing a particularly strong base in the United States, where proponents sought to develop means of

using teaching to combat racism, sexism, and capitalism.

Freire's critical pedagogy was developed in response to what he saw as the disempowering education in Brazil that mirrored the corrupt political system. He saw the educational system as a politically-laden and oppressive process. It was a process that viewed students as depositories. He uses the analogy of banking to describe the process.

Paulo Freire's work has influenced people working in education, community development, community health and many other fields. Freire developed an approach to education that links the identification of issues to positive action for change and development. While Freire's original work was in adult literacy,  $\frac{1}{2}$
