Prenatal maternal anxiety and early childhood temperament

Prenatal maternal anxiety can be subdivided into three different types: trait anxiety (TA), state anxiety (SA), and pregnancy-specific anxiety (PSA). TA refers to the mother's relatively stable propensity for anxiety whereas SA refers to the temporary anxious feeling the mother develops due to a stressful event, which may or may not be related to her pregnancy [11].

Anxiety During Pregnancy: Tips for Coping

In the present review, we examine the association between maternal prenatal stress or anxiety and children's early negative reactivity or self-regulation. The review includes 32 studies that focus on pregnancy-related anxiety, state or trait anxiety, perceived stress, and stressful life events in relation to child's crying, temperament, or behavior during the first 2 years of life.

A longitudinal study of a sample of women and their offspring from two urban areas (N = 233) was conducted to test whether maternal prenatal anxiety trajectories from early to late pregnancy are associated with 12-month infant developmental outcomes, independent of maternal postpartum anxiety symptoms, prenatal and postpartum depressive symptoms, parity, birth outcomes and maternal education.

According to a new study in the Journal of the American Academy of Child & Adolescent Psychiatry (), specific interventions may be needed in pregnancy to promote early offspring psychopathology health and wellbeing.. Few studies have attempted to identify how distinct dimensions of maternal prenatal affective symptoms relate to offspring psychopathology.

Recent findings: Accumulating evidence over the past 2 decades has established that prenatal and early-life psychological stress and stress correlates (e.g., maternal anxiety or depression) increase the risk for childhood respiratory disorders. Recent systematic reviews and meta-analyses including numerous prospective epidemiological and case-control studies substantiate a significant effect of prenatal stress and stress in early childhood on the development of wheeze, asthma, and other ...

Evidence Establishing a Link Between Prenatal and Early ...

Prenatal maternal anxiety was associated with reduced IFN-γ and increased IL-4 responder cell frequencies at 6 months of age, independent of obstetric and socio-demographic covariates. No effect of prenatal anxiety was found on adaptive immunity at 2 months of age.

Prenatal Maternal Anxiety Predicts Reduced Adaptive ...

Maternal anxiety was measured with the Crown-Crisp Experiential Index at 18 and 32 gestational weeks, and two and 21 months postpartum. Mothers scoring in the top 15% at one or more of the four time points were considered to have anxiety.

Pre- and post-natal maternal anxiety and early childhood ...

Prenatal maternal state and pregnancy-specific anxiety (PSA) were measured five times during pregnancy, and maternal state anxiety was measured again at 2 years post partum. Child temperament was measured at 2 years using the Early Childhood Behavior Questionnaire.

Anxiety symptoms are also heterogeneous in nature, yet most studies of prenatal maternal anxiety and offspring developmental outcomes have focused on rather general measures of stress and anxiety, with stressful life events and state anxiety being the most common. 1 Thus, it is difficult to determine whether specific components of anxiety are ...

Maternal Prenatal Mood, Pregnancy-Specific Worries, and ...

Maternal depression, anxiety, and stress during pregnancy have been associated with poor fetal development and poor birth outcomes, including preterm birth (PTB) and low birth weight (LBW) [4, 7]. PTB or LBW children are at risk of emotional or cognitive problems, including an increased risk of attention deficit/hyperactivity, anxiety, or language delay [8].

Effects of Antenatal Maternal Depression and Anxiety on ...

The signs and symptoms of depression during pregnancy are the same as those that occur with depression in the general population. However, additional clues that might indicate depression during pregnancy include: Excessive anxiety about your baby Low self-esteem, such as feelings of inadequacy about parenthood

Higher symptom levels of antenatal anxiety were related to less optimal maternal-fetal quality of attachment, more negative attitudes towards motherhood and the self as mother. Similar trends were found for symptoms of depression, however depression was not significantly related to psychological adjustment to pregnancy variables.
