The Liberty Bell - US History

The earliest known use of the phrase "The Liberty Bell" was by the American Anti-Slavery Society - it appeared in the February 1835 issue of "The Anti-Slavery Record." On July 8, 1776, the Liberty Bell summoned citizens of Philadelphia for the reading of the Declaration of Independence.
